"Open to all - whether up until now only singing in the shower or an experienced singer"

**ETCetera** is now almost two years old, with members coming mainly from the Departments for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs (Defra); Transport (DfT); Communities & Local Government (DCLG), but with others from Energy & Climate Change (DECC); the Home Office; and the Church of England. The choir rehearses together for an hour on Thursday lunchtimes. An Easter performance of Handel's Messiah raised £1,283, and in total performances have so far raised £2,678 for local charities.
