The Civil Service Choir brings together staff from almost all Government Departments and agencies in Westminster. Today's service is the choir's 123rd performance since its first performance here in St Stephen's in November 2009. At full strength the choir boasts over 150 members and performs with orchestra. It regularly gives concerts both here at St Stephen's and at St John's Smith Square.

Through its concerts the choir has raised almost £37,000 for charity.
